

### Salt Springs Celebration Saturday, August 30, 11 a.m.

There's truly something for everyone at the Celebration this year.

Displays range from antiques and quilts to insects and bugs to goods and services from around the county.

Learn how to make cheese, buy a felt hat, hold an exotic bird, go on a scavenger hunt, or adopt a kitten. Check out all the vendors and organizations, listed below.

**Ross Park's ZooMobile** will be here from 1 to 4 pm. Staff will bring four to six touchable and nontouchable animals (a mix of mammals, reptiles, amphibians, and invertebrates). View the animals up close, and ask questions.

Selected items from the **John F. McKeage Collection** of country artifacts, farm and agricultural implements, and tools will be exhibited in the dairy barn. Some were used with animals, some for farming, and some for building and fixing things. Peruse the fine examples illustrating the simplicity, ingenuity, and reality of local rural life.

### Music on the Porch

**11 am: John Gunn**, described as a "mini Bob Dylan" and a newcomer to our stage, kicks off the Celebration this year.

**12 pm: Kelly and Susan Pratt** will pump it up with a mix of folk and Irish music.
